#### MISSION

The mission of the LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE FOUNDATION OF CANADA (LACF) is to promote the ideals and values of the profession of landscape architecture – these values are shared by individuals as well as groups and organizations that practice our profession. The principal objective of LACF is to support research, communication and scholarships which reflect these ideals.

Since 1988, also thanks to the generous Frances McLeod Blue legacy, LACF received donations in excess of \$700,000. The Foundation's assets at the end of 2015 were approximately \$487,000. These funds reflect donations from specific funds, from landscape architecture firms as well as those in aligned professions, and from component organizations of the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects (CSLA-AAPC). Since its beginning, the Foundation awarded over 118 grants and scholarships totalling more than \$450,000. The Foundation also provided financial support to students, organizations and professionals in numerous disciplines, as well as to the CSLA-AAPC and its component organizations for special projects. The outcome of these grants served to recognize the role of landscape architects while at the same time acknowledging other contributors who, combined, create awareness of the importance of landscapes to society, the environment and the economics of the country.

#### **SUMMARY OF 2015 ACTIVITIES**

If 2014 was described as a year of important accomplishments, 2015 can be described as a year of renewal; creating new directions. First, we need to recognize the stepping down of Cecelia Paine, outgoing President who led the Foundation with devotion and excellence for almost a decade. As President and as a Board member, this untiring leader contributed to the creation of Landscapes Paysages and more recently to the publication of Ron William's History of Landscape Architecture in Canada, to name but a few. Cecelia agreed to continue to serve on the LACF Board in the new position of Past President, ensuring continuity and access to her profound institutional memory by today's LACF directors. Thank you Cecelia for your extreme generosity and dedication.

As a result of bylaw revisions approved two years ago, LACF welcomed 100 members. Members are individuals who donate in excess of \$100 in a given year to the Foundation.

While the launch of Ron William's book took place at the 2014 CSLA Congress in Ottawa, the financial support of both the CSLA-AAPC and the LACF allowed him to conduct a 2014-2015 pan Canadian book tour, talking to members and the public alike. He continued to lecture and appear at conferences during 2015 and even in 2016. These efforts earned Ron a CSLA Award of Honour as well as the John Brinckerhoff Jackson Book Prize awarded by the Foundation of Landscape studies in 2016. The Foundation is proud to have contributed to this meaningful work that will enhance the understanding of the historic importance of landscapes in Canada.

Donations continued to increase in 2015, a total of almost \$59,000 was raised for various funds and activities. These activities included the reverse auction conducted by Peter Briggs at the 2015 CSLA Congress in Mexico, the Fellows ASK campaign, special fund raising for Scholarships in Qc and BC to name a few.

Sincere thanks to Peter Briggs (Foundation Board member) for organizing the reverse auction fundraiser. In addition, Cam Patterson (former Board member) once again donated a piece of his art that raised an additional \$2,000 during the closing banquet. These funds were used to support the LACF Andre Schwabenbauer Award.

#### **CAMPAIGN OF FELLOWS**

The CSLA Campaign of Fellows, organized by Peter Kreuk and Wendy Graham (both Foundation Board members and Fellows) and held in conjunction with the Scholarship fundraising initiatives in BC and Qc, was very successful. LACF thanks members of the College of Fellows for their continued support and generosity. The COF annual fundraising campaign which began in 1988 was extended in 2015 to all members of the CSLA community.

# SCHOLARSHIP AND THE NATIONAL ANDRE SCHWABENBAUER AWARD

The 2015 recipients of the LACF Andre Schwabenbauer Awards were Michelle Peeters (BLA program) and Emily French (MLA program) at the University of Guelph. This Award recognizes academic achievement as well as involvment in related community or volunteer efforts.

2015 marked a rethink of how LACF manages its scholarships. Further to earlier discussions in 2014, the Foundation Board decided it wanted to expand its student scholarship program to allow awarding six annual scholarships, one to each existing accredited university program. After significant study and at times debate, a LACF Scholarship Task Force was formed (Vincent Asselin, Karen Le Gresley Hamre, Ed Versteeg & Wendy Graham) supported by Ron Middleton, Peter Kreuk and Don Hester to draft a new detailed policy for the LACF scholarship program. This draft policy is being submitted to the LACF Board in late April 2016 for their consideration and approval.

The objective of the draft policy is to create partnered scholarships between the Foundation, the Universities and the Component Organizations, allowing for a new annual scholarship for each accredited program. The Foundation anticipates a three-year transition period to achieve this, and envisions establishing individual endowments to support each scholarship.

In October 2015, the Foundation, in conjunction with the AAPQ and the Université de Montréal, launched a fundraising campaign during the AAPQ's 50th Anniversary Gala and raised approximately \$20,00 in commitments. During that same period, the BCSLA and the University of British Columbia also approached the BC community and have already confirmed commitments in excess of

\$35,000. From these successful experiences, the Foundation now intends to approach other Associations and programs to establish similar joint partnerships. Once the transition period has successful transpired (three years), the Foundation intends to enhance its national Andre Schwabenbauer Scholarship program.

The Foundation is indebted to Peter Kreuk and Jane Durante for their tremendous leadership that gave rise to this new approach as well as those universities and component associations involved, including Isabelle Giasson AAPQ President, Wendy Graham and Bernard St-Denis for their efforts and support in Quebec as well as Ron Middleton in Alberta. Much work remains to be done and these recent successes bode well for more such programs in the future.

#### PETER KLYNSTRA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The funds donated for the Peter Klynstra Memorial Scholarship, established by APALA in memory of Peter Klynstra, grew to \$24,000 thanks to generous contributions. The Peter Klynstra Memorial Scholarship was presented to Aislin Livingstone, enrolled in the University of Guelph's 2017 MLA program.

#### FRANCES MCLEOD BLUE FUND

As it does every year, LACF made a \$1,000 contribution to the Frances McLeod Blue Fund, in memory of her generous contribution to the Foundation; this donation allows students to catalogue the numerous documents in the Macklin Hancock collection housed at the University of Guelph.

#### **2015 GRANTS PROGRAM**

#### **TREASURER**


